February 25: "Leadings and Discernment" with David Arnold

An important part of Quaker practice is listening with the hope that what we hear in the silence will lead us in unexpected ways. Discernment is the practice of taking such a leading, testing it, feeling it through, and integrating it into one's life. Ideally after a discernment process, one achieves a sense of clearness, where strength flows from the leading through us to our actions. I will speak about my experiences with this process.

Forum on Proposed Renovations

A *forum* for MqtUU members and friends, with architects from Studio RAD, will be held at **12:15 p.m on Sunday, February 11th** after the regular service. The purpose of this comprehensive meeting is the presentation of a menu of alternatives for the design of the MqtUU building's sanctuary, as well as other



interior renovations to the building. Four distinct alternative designs have been recommended as viable alternatives to revise the sanctuary space to become a more distinct, sacred, modern, and attractive space for services and other functions. Other interior renovation alternatives include flooring, lighting, audio-visual, and decorative elements. Approximate costs associated with the various alternatives will be presented as well.

The MqtUU Board of Trustees is seeking feedback from members and friends on the design alternatives, and this will be the best opportunity available to learn about these design options from the architects. Architect Joy Cardillo will present the design portfolio and then the assembled members and friends will be encouraged to share their thoughts and discuss the options presented. The BoT will follow up with the congregation on next steps after their February board meeting. Please attend this important meeting is you can. MqtUU Put Our Faith in Action @ 2018 Women's March

Our Congregation was challenged by Michigan UUs for Social Justice [MUUSJN] to fill up 20 petitions that seek legislation that would raise the minimum wage in Michigan, phase out tipping by raising food servers' base pay, and entitle workers to at least one hour of paid sick leave for every 30 hours worked.

We met the challenge bigly. A cadre comprised of Kathy Campbell, Anne Stark, Katelynn Jensen, Heidi Gould, Nicole Harrington and g.g. gordon, took the petitions to the Women's March on Sunday, January 21, 2018, and got all the signature spaces filled! The completed petitions have been sent back downstate for submission to the government.

Watch this space for updates on the progress of these requests for change that are aimed at reducing poverty and income inequality. Much gratitude to all the canvassers who were willing to get out there and put our faith into action. Great work everyone!
